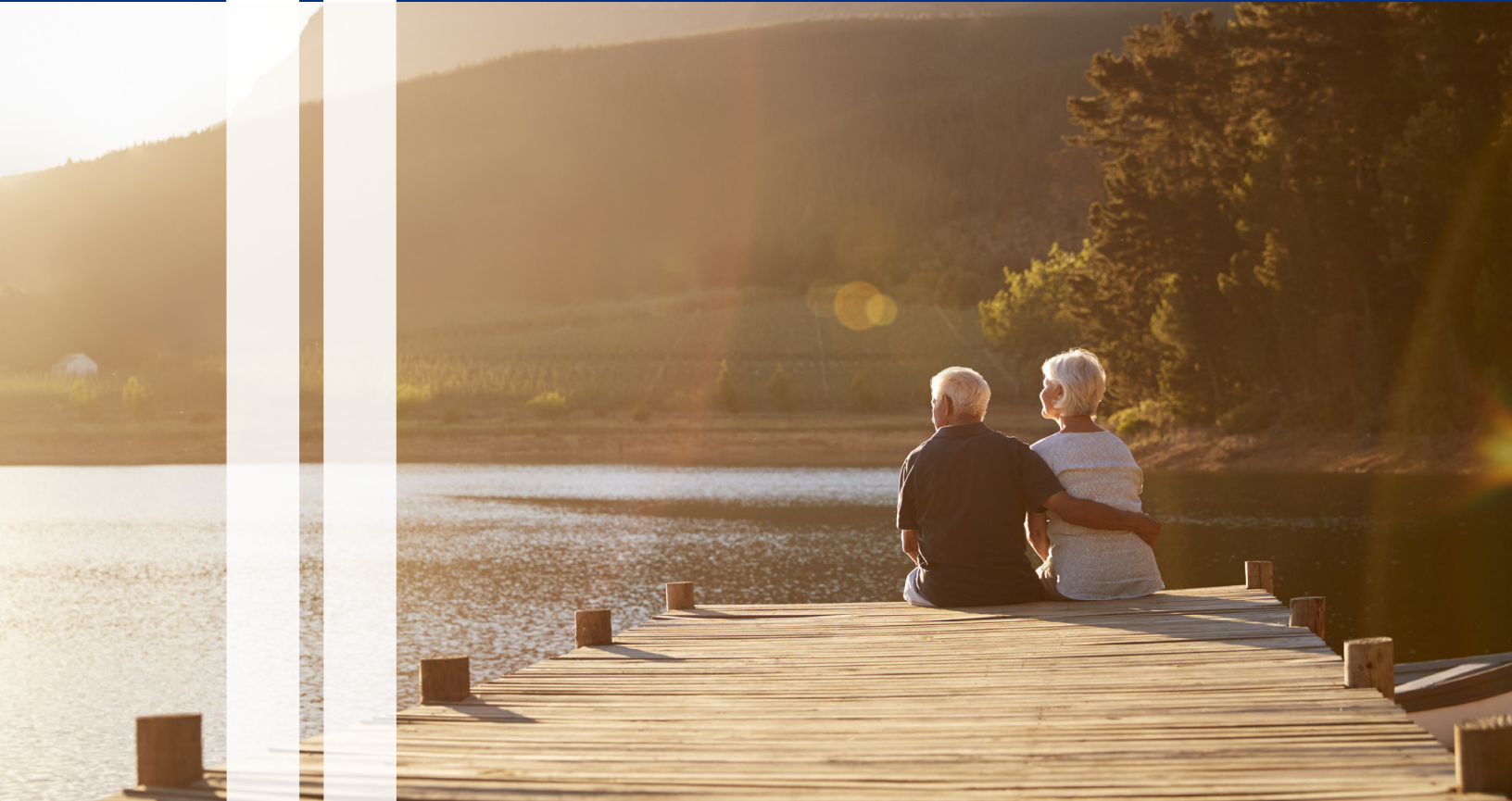

<p>Construct a 90-bed (approximately 140,000 square foot) Veterans Nursing Home in Bowling Green in the Community Living Concept. A 18-20 acre building site at the Kentucky Intermodal Transpark will accommodate the new facility. The proposed project will primarily serve 17 counties with an underserved veteran population of over 28,000 and a secondary service area of 7 counties with over 14,000 veterans. Of the 24 counties served by the project, the largest concentration of veterans can be found in Warren County at nearly 8,000. Kentucky's current veteran population is over 330,000. Currently there are four Veterans Nursing homes in Kentucky. The location of a new home in Warren County would fill a void of underserved veterans of a primary service area. This location is also recommended as the 5th site of a state veterans nursing home as was identified as a part of a feasibility study conducted in 2016.</p>

The following four facilities are included in the funding authorized: Mason County Middle School (\$19,784,500); Garrison Elementary School (\$12,931,700); Clearfield Elementary School (\$7,527,100); and Green County High School (\$7,283,700).</p>

The Kentucky Board of Education will determine the allocations from this fund on a rational basis that takes into account the rankings, and whether a school district has levied a ten-cent equivalent tax dedicated to capital improvements but remains unable to cash fund or to sufficiently support the required annual debt service for replacement or renovation of the school. The amounts allocated shall represent the difference between the cost to replace or renovate the designated facility and the amount of available local resources.</p>

<p>KRS 151.291 authorizes the Energy and Environment Cabinet (EEC) to ensure dams owned by the Commonwealth comply with state dam safety regulations and requirements. Of the 72 dams the Commonwealth owns, some require rehabilitation and repair to meet these requirements. The proposed rehabilitation of Willisburg Lake Dam will include installation of a drainage blanket, spillway upgrades, and buttress to address stability and slope issues on the dam. Capital improvements on the dam are required due to its "high hazard" classification – meaning there are residences in the downstream inundation zone of the dam. Engineering assessments including geotechnical, hydrologic, and hydraulic analyses are required to design dam-related rehabilitation and mitigation measures for Clements Lake Dam in Rowan County and Boltz Lake Dam in Grant County. The assessments will provide updated information on the dams' physical conditions, the engineering design required for the dam to meet state dam safety regulations and requirements, capital construction needs, and to identify rehabilitation and mitigation options.</p>
