# Design and Repair Dam 7 Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$6,400,000 from Restricted Funds to the project to repair and extend the life of Dam 7, which holds the water supply for the City of Harrodsburg. Repairs will include reconstructing the existing dam apron, cribbing, armor dam toe, upstream sheet riling and repairing a cracked divider wall. A new upper sill splash pad will also be added.

# **Design Lock 5 Reauthorization**

This project reauthorizes \$800,000 in Restricted Funds to design the needed repairs to open Lock 5 to river navigation and extend the life of the dam. Dam 5 provides water to the City of Versailles, the City of Lawrenceburg, and the Hanson Aggregate Rock Quarry. Repairs needed will include reconditioning steel lock gates, installing new operating equipment, replacing derrick stone, refacing the wall with shotcrete, and adding a concrete splash pad.

# Locks 2 and 3 Upper Guide Wall Repairs Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$4,131,000 in Restricted Funds to repair Locks 2 and Lock 3 guide walls. It is important to replace these walls as navigation is open to recreational boaters from Frankfort to the Ohio River at Carrollton, Kentucky.

As with any telecommunications network, core equipment must be upgraded at appropriate intervals to continue to provide the flexibility, bandwidth and performance needed to provide service to the agencies connected to the network. This system refresh is included in the KentuckyWired contract as a Commonwealth obligation. This refresh will be implemented over 3 biennial periods, and it provides for the replacement of the core optical switching, core routing, and edge routing equipment utilized by the KentuckyWired network to provide services to agencies located in all 120 counties across the state of Kentucky. The nature of this project is such that its asset requirements are fluid.

This project allows the Commonwealth to purchase twenty telecommunication shelters that house the core network nodes of the KentuckyWired network. Structural failures of the original shelters, such as water damage and mold, required the replacement of the original shelters. New shelters were purchased and financed by the Commonwealth's project vendor under a separate contract, which allowed the project to continue without further delays. The Commonwealth owned the original shelters, but the replacement shelters do not belong to the Commonwealth today. This project allows the Commonwealth to purchase the twenty shelters.

The existing Unemployment System was created in the 1970's and is still being utilized today. This project will migrate the current mainframe system to a new platform, which includes the modernization of the legacy codes and the database system.

The first three phases of replacing the State Police's emergency radio system were funded in the last three budgets totaling \$168,459,000. Overall, the project will replace the existing statewide emergency radio communications network which has reached the end of its life-cycle after 17 years. The new system will ensure a common technology platform and interoperable communications for those on the network. The existing system provides day to day emergency radio communications between the State Police dispatch, the State Police, Commercial Vehicle Enforcement, Ky. Fish and Wildlife, Attorney General's Office, Alcoholic Beverage Control, and other state agencies. This additional funding is for increased costs to radio tower equipment that must be replaced at 30 existing tower sites in Eastern Kentucky, and equipment for 17 new towers to be constructed during Phase III. This specific equipment must be procured in order for these Phase III towers to be interoperable within the larger statewide network and prior phases of tower construction and upgrades. This additional funding also includes costs related to the construction of 17 new tower sites in Eastern Kentucky, which present with unique topography and access challenges, and have been impacted by escalation of construction materials and labor since initial cost estimates were developed. This additional funding only supports the portion of Phase III to be executed in the 24-26 biennium. The project will be reassessed and estimated for the remainder of Phase III new construction, to be completed in a future biennium.

The aircraft replacement will prevent further costly investments in maintaining the Learjet and King Air, both of which are owned by the Dept of Defense.

#### Lease - Jefferson CTC - Bullitt County Campus

Jefferson Community and Technical College has leased space in Bullitt County. The current lease is approximately 30,000 gross square feet. Bullitt County is one of the most rapidly growing counties in Kentucky and with its access to interstate 65 and interstate 264, it is ideally situated for continued growth and economic development which would be further enhanced by access to postsecondary education and workforce development programs. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

#### Lease - Jefferson CTC - Jefferson Education Center

This lease encompasses approximately 36,651 square feet of office, service and storage space in downtown Louisville adjacent to the Downtown Campus of Jefferson Community and Technical College. This space has just been completely renovated. The leased space has been used to relocate and consolidate all student services functions for the college. Previously, those functions had been dispersed among several buildings on multiple campuses. This was very inefficient for the college staff and extremely inconvenient for students. The space vacated in other buildings has, in most instances been converted back into instructional space, in other instances it has permitted the departments to expand into more suitable and less cramped guarters. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

#### Lease - KCTCS System Office

This is a lease-purchase agreement with the City of Versailles whereby the City secured funding to renovate a building located at 300 North Main Street in Versailles to create office and conference space for the KCTCS System Office. In turn, KCTCS agrees to repay the City for its costs in acquiring and renovating the property over 20 years, at which time KCTCS will assume ownership of the property. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.
