The new facility will ensure mission readiness and to protect mission essential equipment.

The antiquated system delivers slow, manual and inefficient services to the businesses the Department regulates.

Kentucky River Authority

Design and Repair Dam 7 6,400,000

Restricted Funds 6,400,000

This project will repair and extend the life of Dam 7, which holds the water supply for the City of Harrodsburg. Repairs will include reconstructing the existing dam apron, cribbing, armor dam toe, upstream sheet piling and repairing a cracked divider wall. A new upper sill splash pad will also be added.

Design Lock 5 800,000

Restricted Funds 800,000

This project will design the needed repairs to open Lock 5 to river navigation and extend the life of the dam. Dam 5 provides water to the City of Versailles, the City of Lawrenceburg and the Hanson Aggregate Rock Quarry. Repairs needed will include reconditioning steel lock gates, installing new operating equipment, replacing derrick stone, refacing the wall with shotcrete, and adding a concrete splash pad.

Locks 2 and 3 Upper Guide Wall Repairs Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$4,131,000 in Restricted Fund repairs to Locks 2 and Lock 3 guide walls. It is important to replace these walls since navigation is open to recreational boaters from Frankfort to the Ohio River at Carrollton, Kentucky.

School Facilities Construction Commission Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes SFCC Offers of Assistance in the amount of \$152,000,000 in bond funds. This amount reflects unused, escrowed offers of assistance from the 2012-14, 2014-16, 2016-18, 2018-20, and 2020-22 budgets.

State Schools Safety/Security Pool - 2022-2024 3,100,000 General Fund 3,100,000

The Safety/Security Pool provides the department with funding to address safety and security primarily for the Kentucky School for the Deaf, the Kentucky School for the Blind and the Future Farmers of America Leadership Training Center. Projects such as integrated campus-wide fire, weather and alert systems, window hardware and replacement, card-readers, doors and lighting, campus security cameras, fencing, exterior/interior doors, door locks, gates and moving technology servers to secure locations will be the primary focus of this program.

The Roof Pool provides the department with a source of funds for roof renovation projects, primarily for the Kentucky School for the Deaf, the Kentucky School for the Blind and the Future Farmers of America Leadership Training Center. Maintenance projects, such as mechanical repair, equipment and materials storage, sidewalk and railing improvements, exterior structure repairs, flooring, plumbing and electrical repair, fire prevention maintenance, and modifications to structures to meet health and safety standards are the principal components of the program.

Kentucky School for the Deaf Lee Hall Renovation 1,000,000 General Fund 1,000,000

This project will renovate Lee Hall at the Kentucky School for the Deaf to provide additional classrooms and a Deaf-friendly auditorium for plays, student meetings, graduation, and other Deaf events. Lee Hall will also house the Statewide Education Resource Center on Deafness.

This authorization will allow Finance and Administration Cabinet and other state agencies to proceed with energy efficiency projects that can be paid for from savings in the agency's operating budget. These contracts may function as lease-purchase procurements, using the resulting energy savings as payment for the improvements, as provided by KRS 56.770 to 56.784. Finance will administer the projects under this authorization.

The first two phases of replacing the State Police's emergency radio system were funded in the last two budgets totaling \$87.6 million. The final phase is funded at \$80.9 million in the 2022-24 budget. Overall, the project will replace the existing statewide emergency radio communications network which has reached the end of its life-cycle after 17 years. The new system will ensure a common technology platform and interoperable communications for those on the network. The existing system provides day to day emergency radio communications between the State Police dispatch, the State Police, Commercial Vehicle Enforcement, Ky. Fish and Wildlife, Attorney General's Office, Alcoholic Beverage Control and other state agencies. Phase III includes purchasing and installing new P25 700 MHz infrastructure equipment for existing towers and green site towers to be identified, developed, and constructed in the Eastern Kentucky post areas. In addition, this project includes funding to modernize the Kentucky Emergency Warning System network components and address the risk of failing hardware for public safety and disaster recovery to include new hardware such as microwave radio, routers and switches, and batteries at 120 sites and generators at 27 sites.

Its reliability will continue to drop as the age of the aircraft increases. Parts and materials availability diminish as the aircraft ages. The current King Air is limited to only 18 of the state's airports with a full payload. Its replacement would operate out of 45 of the 57 Kentucky airports.

The Kentucky Emergency Warning System is the Commonwealth's public safety wireless network which provides the communications backbone and infrastructure for nearly all of the first responders throughout the state. The design for the Little Sandy Correctional Complex expansion was authorized by House Bill 192 of the 2021 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The Little Sandy Correctional Complex was built with the intention of expanding and this project is for the expansion of the medium security prison located in Elliott County by 816 beds. The project will consist of constructing two 408-bed dormitories. This project is necessary due to the significant physical deterioration of the 84-year old Kentucky State Reformatory, and the inability to recruit and retain correctional staff in a competitive local labor market. Upon completion of this expansion, the Kentucky State Reformatory will be closed.

Eastern Kentucky Correctional Complex Renovations 25,236,900 General Fund 25,236,900

The Eastern Kentucky Correctional Complex is 33 years old. The exterior wall insulated finishing system and all exterior windows and doors are in poor condition and are out of warranty, impeding operations and increasing maintenance costs. A complete building envelope replacement is necessary for several buildings. This project will also update the smoke evacuation system and HVAC systems.

Modern technology is necessary to allow full participation in database access and resource sharing through the Kentucky Virtual Library.

The new residence hall will also include generous commons areas for student interaction and recreation. This new facility will replace the obsolete and deteriorating Cartmell Hall.

Compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) will require changes to architectural barriers, elevators, fire alarm systems, signage, telecommunications and other areas primarily in the university's auxiliary facilities.

This project reauthorizes \$4,539,000 in Agency Bonds for minor auxiliary capital renewal and maintenance projects that emerge from year-to-year and are completed as funds are available.

Replace Turf on Jacobs Field Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$1,102,000 in Agency Bonds to replace the turf at Jacobs Field (football field), which has exceeded its useful life and requires constant repairs. The field would be replaced with new turf.

This project reauthorizes \$3,812,000 in Agency Bonds to provide for the complete renovation of the south third of the ground floor of the Alumni Tower Residence Hall (17,000 Gross Square Feet). Currently this space is outfitted as a commercial kitchen with a small office area, loading dock, and public restrooms. The remainder of the ground floor was converted to office space for Housing & COMA. With the completion of the Rocky Adkins Dining Hall project in 2018, this facility has been taken out of service as a primary dining facility. Located centrally and easily accessible, it has been determined that the best possible reuse for the space of this building would be as a living and learning commons. Work will include removal of all kitchen equipment and demolition of the food preparation and food sales areas. New construction will include steel stud and gypsum board partitions, suspended acoustic ceilings, new lighting, additional electrical service and outlets, modifications and expansions of the fire protection system, and modifications and expansions of the HVAC system to accommodate this renovation.

Renovate Laurel South Campus Phase I- Somerset CC Restricted Funds Bond Funds 4,800,000

This project will renovate approximately 18,000 gross square feet of Laurel South at Somerset Community College. The building is in desperate need of renovation. The original building was constructed in 1971, and certain program spaces are grossly undersized to meet current needs. This project will expand those programs that have demonstrated rapid growth and will better align space needs to meet changes in industry demand. This will be the first of three phases for renovating the building.

KCTCS Equipment Pool - 2022-2024

The Kentucky Fire Commission(KyFC)/State Fire Rescue Training(SFRT) provides training and accredited certification to the Kentucky Fire Service, as well as Industrial customers and firefighters from across the nation. This project provides funding to purchase new equipment needed in teaching and training.

Construct Fire Commission NRPC Classroom Bldg. - Addl Reauth

This project reauthorizes \$5,200,000 in Restricted Funds and adds \$1,800,000 in Restricted Funds to construct a classroom and office building for the Fire Commission on the campus of the National Response Preparedness Center (NRPC). This approximate 16,000 gross square foot facility will provide classroom instruction for paid and volunteer firefighters throughout the state for their certification.

Purchase Construction Grade 3D Printer - Somerset

This project is to purchase a Construction Grade 3D printer for Somerset Community College. Additive manufacturing (AM), also known as 3D printing, is quickly being integrated into modern manufacturing as a new method for creating next generation products. AM products are now clearly present in cars, aircraft, military equipment, consumer items, medical components, and general hardware. The printer is needed to ensure students have the knowledge and skills to be successful in AM.

Guaranteed Energy Savings Performance Contracts

The intent of this project is to provide the authority to undertake guaranteed energy savings projects as outlined in House Bill 639 and passed by the 1998 General Assembly. The types of projects and their locations are to be determined subsequent to energy audits and feasibility analyses of KCTCS facilities. Some or all of the projects identified can be expected to exceed \$1,000,000 in scope. The projects should result in substantial energy savings for the institutions undertaking them. These savings will be used to pay for the projects over an 8 to 12 year period via payments to the project contractor.

Upgrade Welding Shop-Big Sandy CTC, Mayo Reauth

This project reauthorizes \$1,500,000 in Restricted Funds to complete renovation of the welding area on the Mayo Campus. The Welding area on the Mayo Campus of Big Sandy Community and Technical College was built in the 1960s and has had no facility upgrades since its construction. The 6,700 square foot facility is outdated and does not meet current OSHA, EPA and electrical code guidelines. Ventilation and lighting are inadequate, and the facility lacks space enough to meet current and future student and industry demand.

Upgrade IT Infrastructure - Gateway CTC Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$1,500,000 in Restricted Funds to improve the IT and safety and security infrastructure for Gateway Community and Technical College. Due to aging equipment the need to update technology is crucial to the success of our students. The IT infrastructure upgrade will allow for state of the art labs, collaborative classrooms, interactive learning and community engagement centers. The Safety, Security, and Student ID Technology Upgrade project will increase access, efficiency, and availability of interactive usage opportunities for students and employees.

Construct/Procure Transportation Ctr - ECTC Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$5,000,000 in Restricted Funds to construct and/or procure an approximate 25,000 gross square foot Transportation Logistics Center for Elizabethtown CTC to relocate current Auto/Diesel programs, and add additional space for the Agriculture Mechanics, CDL, Logistics, and possibly Heavy Equipment programs.

Renovate Advance Manuf and Constr Center - Hazard CTC Reauth

This project reauthorizes \$1,000,000 in Restricted Funds and \$3,900,000 in Federal Funds to renovate approximately 29,000 square feet in the Industrial Education Building which was built in 1961 on the Hazard Community and Technical College Technical Campus. The renovation is needed to accommodate programs in Construction Technology, Electrical Technology, Heating Ventilation Air Conditioning (HVAC) Technology, Automotive Technology and Diesel Technology.

Construct Fire Comm Five Story Training Drill Tower Reauth

This project reauthorizes \$1,200,000 in Restricted Funds to construct a tower and burn building for the Fire Commission on the campus of the National Response Preparedness Center (NRPC). This facility will be used to train firefighters for their 150 hour certification for volunteers and their 400 hour certification for paid career firefighters.

Renovate Industrial Education Building - Hazard CTC Reauth

This project reauthorizes \$2,500,000 in Federal Funds to renovate 6,400 square feet of instructional space and upgrade infrastructure in the Industrial Education Building which was built in 1961 on the Hazard Community and Technical College Technical Campus. The programs will include welding, CNC machining, tool and die.

Elizabethtown CTC - Hardin County - Lease

Elizabethtown Community and Technical College will be renovating the Occupational Technical Building and will need to relocate the Transportation program. Approximately 25,000 gross square feet of leased space in Hardin County will be used for the Transportation program. The cost of this lease is expected to be more than \$200,000.

Jefferson CTC - Bullitt County Campus - Lease

Jefferson Community and Technical College has leased space in Bullitt County. The current lease is approximately 30,000 gross square feet. Bullitt County is one of the most rapidly growing counties in Kentucky and with its access to interstate 65 and interstate 264, it is ideally situated for continue growth and economic development which would be further enhanced by access to postsecondary education and workforce development programs. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

Jefferson CTC - Jefferson Education Center - Lease

This lease encompasses approximately 36,651 square feet of office, service and storage space in downtown Louisville adjacent to the Downtown Campus of Jefferson Community and Technical College. This space has just been completely renovated. The leased space has been used to relocate and consolidate all student services functions for the college. Previously, those functions had been dispersed among several buildings on multiple campuses. This was very inefficient for college staff and extremely inconvenient for students. The space vacated in other buildings has, in most instances been converted back into instructional space, in other instances it has permitted departments to expand into more suitable and less cramped quarters. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

Maysville CTC - Rowan County - Lease

Maysville Community and Technical College has a lease in Rowan County. The leased space is approximately 45,000 gross square feet. The lease cost is more than \$200,000.

KCTCS System Office - Lease

This is a lease-purchase agreement with the City of Versailles whereby the City secured funding to renovate a building located at 300 North Main Street in Versailles to create office and conference space for the KCTCS System Office. In turn, KCTCS agrees to repay the City for its costs in acquiring and renovating the property over 20 years, at which time KCTCS will assume ownership of the property. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.
