### Kentucky River Authority

#### **Design and Repair Dam 7 Reauthorization**

This project reauthorizes \$6,400,000 from Restricted Funds to the project to repair and extend the life of Dam 7, which holds the water supply for the City of Harrodsburg. Repairs will include reconstructing the existing dam apron, cribbing, armor dam toe, upstream sheet riling and repairing a cracked divider wall. A new upper sill splash pad will also be added.

#### **Design Lock 5 Reauthorization**

This project reauthorizes \$800,000 in Restricted Funds to design the needed repairs to open Lock 5 to river navigation and extend the life of the dam. Dam 5 provides water to the City of Versailles, the City of Lawrenceburg, and the Hanson Aggregate Rock Quarry. Repairs needed will include reconditioning steel lock gates, installing new operating equipment, replacing derrick stone, refacing the wall with shotcrete, and adding a concrete splash pad.

### Locks 2 and 3 Upper Guide Wall Repairs Reauthorization

This project reauthorizes \$4,131,000 in Restricted Funds to repair Locks 2 and Lock 3 guide walls. It is important to replace these walls as navigation is open to recreational boaters from Frankfort to the Ohio River at Carrollton, Kentucky.

### Offers of Assistance - 2022-2024

Bond Funds

This project funds \$85,000,000 in regular offers of assistance that were authorized by House Bill 1 from the 2022 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The offers of assistance were authorized with the expectation of debt service in the 2024-2026 biennium.

### Special Offers of Assistance - 2024-2025

Bond Funds 61,641,000 Special Offers of Assistance are provided for the following schools as stipulated in Part I of the appropriations act: Breckinridge County Middle School; Campbellsville Middle School; Cumberland County Elementary School; Ludlow High School; Inez Elementary School; and Rockcastle County Middle School.

#### Secondary Area Technology Center Renovation Pool - 2025-2026

#### Bond Funds

A pool of funds is provided to support grants of up to \$10,000,000 for the renovation of locally owned secondary area technology centers.

#### **School Facilities Construction Commission Reauthorization**

This project reauthorizes SFCC Offers of Assistance in the amount of \$75,900,000 in bond funds. This amount reflects unused, escrowed offers of assistance from the 2014-16, 2016-18, 2018-20, and 2020-22 budgets.

This project allows the Commonwealth to purchase twenty telecommunication shelters that house the core network nodes of the KentuckyWired network. Structural failures of the original shelters, such as water damage and mold, required the replacement of the original shelters. New shelters were purchased and financed by the Commonwealth's project vendor under a separate contract, which allowed the project to continue without further delays. The Commonwealth owned the original shelters, but the replacement shelters do not belong to the Commonwealth today. This project allows the Commonwealth to purchase the twenty shelters.

# Kentucky Community and Technical College System

## Lease - Elizabethtown CTC - Hardin County

Elizabethtown Community and Technical College will be renovating the Occupational Technical Building and will need to relocate the Transportation program. Approximately 25,000 gross square feet of leased space in Hardin County will be used for the Transportation program. The cost of this lease is expected to be more than \$200,000.

## Lease - Jefferson CTC - Bullitt County Campus

Jefferson Community and Technical College has leased space in Bullitt County. The current lease is approximately 30,000 gross square feet. Bullitt County is one of the most rapidly growing counties in Kentucky and with its access to interstate 65 and interstate 264, it is ideally situated for continued growth and economic development which would be further enhanced by access to postsecondary education and workforce development programs. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

## Lease - Jefferson CTC - Jefferson Education Center

This lease encompasses approximately 36,651 square feet of office, service and storage space in downtown Louisville adjacent to the Downtown Campus of Jefferson Community and Technical College. This space has just been completely renovated. The leased space has been used to relocate and consolidate all student services functions for the college. Previously, those functions had been dispersed among several buildings on multiple campuses. This was very inefficient for the college staff and extremely inconvenient for students. The space vacated in other buildings has, in most instances been converted back into instructional space, in other instances it has permitted the departments to expand into more suitable and less cramped quarters. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

## Lease - KCTCS System Office

This is a lease-purchase agreement with the City of Versailles whereby the City secured funding to renovate a building located at 300 North Main Street in Versailles to create office and conference space for the KCTCS System Office. In turn, KCTCS agrees to repay the City for its costs in acquiring and renovating the property over 20 years, at which time KCTCS will assume ownership of the property. The annual cost of the lease is more than \$200,000.

The proposed size for the facility will be 8,000 sq. ft, have salt storage capacity of 1,500 tons, and will be located on an 8 to 10-acre site. The facility will include an equipment storage shed, salt storage structure, fencing, and a CaCl / brine storage station. Additional funding is needed to complete this project.

### Permanent Salt Conveyor System - Graves County - Reauth.

This project reauthorizes \$350,000 in Road Fund. It will install a permanent salt conveyor system will improve the capacity of the existing salt structure.

## Const. District 2 Office and Materials Lab - ReAuth

This project reauthorizes \$2,000,000 in Road Fund. The project will replace the existing district office and materials lab in District 2 with more spacious and modern facilities. The current accommodations are in very poor condition and over 50 years old. It sits on a small site inadequate for allowing the construction of the type of building needed to provide modern highway maintenance.

Funding for this project is contingent upon approval for the use of Restricted funds from the Aviation Economic Development Fund. This project will construct 16 new T-Hangars to provide secure storage space for civil aviation aircraft. Currently, there is a waiting list of 25 individuals who have expressed an interest in renting T-Hangars to store their personal aircraft. The additional T-Hangars will provide more secure aircraft storage and help generate additional revenue for Kentucky's Capital City Airport.
